#### Share the Plate Recipient for January—Project New Start

Project New Start is a re-entry program for Delaware men and women transitioning out of state and federal prisons. Participants spend 10 weeks together learning cognitive behavioral change, parenting, financial literacy, conflict resolution and technology training. Working in partnership with a wide variety of local organizations, the program has proven highly effective: more than 90% of New Start graduates are placed in jobs and their rate of recidivism (return to prison) is less than 30%, a stark contrast to Delaware's average recidivism rate of 76%. ## 70 1/2+? Happy New Year! (And many more!)

If you have a qualified IRA and think you may want to take advantage of qualified charitable distribution's (QCD) to achieve tax-free required minimum distribution's (RMD) you should evaluate this option before you start making withdrawals from your IRAs this year. Once you have taken it out of your IRA, unless you have handled it in the proper way, you will have to pay taxes on it. You can't put it back! Always consult your IRA custodian and tax and financial advisors to see if you are eligible and it is a good move for you.
