The **Safety Committee** is sponsoring, hands-on educational programs, on Stop-the-Bleed, presented by a member of the Delaware Medical Reserve Corp on **Thursday evening**, 6 p.m. on April 2nd, and Saturday, April 4th at 9 a.m.

Each program is two hours long, with food provided at each event starting 30 minutes prior to each presentation. The program is a national effort, initiated by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, to prepare lay persons to provide assistance to those having bleeding crisises until first

## UUA GA Providence, RI | June 24-28, 2020

General Assembly (GA) is an unforgettable experience for thousands of Unitarian Universalists and partners, who leave with a renewed sense of energy, inspiration, and innovative ideas to take back to their congregations and communities. GA is powerful, because of the ways we connect with each other and share our values. There we will worship, learn, witness, and make decisions together.

Registration is now open at uua.org/ga. Full-time registration is now \$400 for adults, \$240 for high school youth, and \$150 for off-site registrants. Register by March 15 for the lowest rate. Rates will increase on March 16 and again on May 1. The UUA is committed to the goal of making GA accessible to as many attendees as possible. Go to uua.org/ga to learn about scholarships to support participation, particularly of those from marginalized groups and volunteer opportunities (work in exchange for registration).
